




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



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# SGC's Transformative Climate Communities (TCC) Program

- AB 2722 (Burke) signed September 14, 2016
- \$140 Million in 2016-17 (one-time appropriation)
- Eligible entities include, but are not limited to:
  - Nonprofit, community-based, faith-based , or a coalition or association of nonprofit organizations;
  - Community Development Finance Institutions, Community Development Corporations; and
  - Local agencies, joint powers authorities, tribal governments
- Demonstrate multi-stakeholder partnerships with local agencies, community-based organizations, labor groups, workforce investment boards, and other stakeholders, as appropriate.

# SGC's Transformative Climate Communities (TCC) Program

## AB 2722:

“In awarding grants, the council may give priority to plans and projects that cover areas that have a high proportion of census tracts identified as disadvantaged communities and that focus on communities that are most disadvantaged.”

## Governor Brown's Signing Message of AB 2722:

“Given the limited funding available for this program, the State must focus its initial investment on the communities most impacted by poverty and pollution where a substantial State investment can promote significant change.”

# Transformational Climate Communities (TCC) Program

- Funds the development and implementation of neighborhood-level transformative climate community plans
- Projects include multiple, coordinated greenhouse gas emissions reduction projects that provide local economic, environmental, and health benefits
- Supports community-wide transformation in the State's most disadvantaged communities

# TCC: What does the Program look like?

- Program guidelines and application
  - Timeframe: TBD
  - Research & Stakeholder Input
  - Public Workshops & Outreach
- Initial Rulemaking related to geographic distribution of first year funds

# TCC: What does a TCC Project look like?

- What does a TCC project look like?
  - Depends on the community
  - Substantial investment in a single community
  - Multiple, integrated projects as part of broader community vision with specific goals
  - “Demonstrates community engagement in all phases”



# Affordable Housing & Sustainable Communities

## Eligible Capital Projects

1. Affordable Housing Development (loan)  
*Bricks and Mortar*
2. Housing-Related Infrastructure (grant)  
*Required as Condition of Approval*
3. Sustainable Transportation Infrastructure (grant)  
*Transit, Bike Lanes, Sidewalks*
4. Transportation-Related Amenities (grant)  
*Bike Parking, Repair Kiosks, Urban Greening, Bus Shelters*

## Eligible Programs (3 Year Grants)

1. Active Transportation Programs
2. Transit Ridership Programs
3. Criteria Air Pollutant Reduction Programs

# What should I do to prepare for AHSC Round 3?

## Planning & Community Engagement

- Local General, Specific Community Plans
- Sustainable Community Strategy/Regional Transportation Plan
- Active Transportation Plans

## AHSC Project Exploration

- Identification and prioritization of potential projects
- Identification and cultivating relationships between applicants and partners

## AHSC Project Design

- Identify core components of project and lead applicant
- Identify additional partners
- Understand potential GHG reductions from project variations

## Pre-Application

- Stay apprised of AHSC Program Updates & Technical Assistance opportunities
