



## REGIONAL PROGRESS: CITY RESOLUTIONS IN SUPPORT OF PARA TODOS

To advance regional alignment and build political support, the Para Todos campaign leveraged city resolutions as an early-stage engagement strategy with elected officials. These resolutions demonstrate growing regional alignment around a shared vision for equitable revitalization of the Lower LA River. By affirming support at the city level, jurisdictions are positioning themselves to:

- Advance community-centered revitalization efforts
- Align with state funding opportunities (Prop 1, Prop 68, and Prop 4)
- Ensure that future investments benefit existing residents and support communities to thrive in place

As of March 2026, five cities adopted resolutions, two cities were in-progress and seven cities were engaged at Council-Level.

- Early adoption was strongest among SELA cities with prior involvement in AB 530 and the 2018 Revitalization Plan.

**WHEREAS**, the City of [CITY NAME] has long supported equitable investment along the Lower Los Angeles River and served as an active participant in the AB 530 Working Group, which helped shape the 2018 Lower Los Angeles River Revitalization Plan through collaboration with state agencies, local jurisdictions, and community stakeholders; and

**WHEREAS**, the Lower LA River corridor is home to culturally rich, historically underserved communities that have experienced environmental injustice and a lack of public investment over decades; and

**WHEREAS**, the Lower Los Angeles River Revitalization Plan outlines a bold, community-informed vision to transform the river into a safe, healthy, and vibrant resource, delivering environmental and economic benefits while honoring the people who live along its banks; and **WHEREAS**, the Plan identifies 155 multi-benefit project opportunity areas and emphasizes the importance of inclusive planning that reflects the needs and priorities of local residents and small businesses; and

**WHEREAS**, the Lower LA River Para Todos campaign is being led by the San Gabriel and Lower LA Rivers and Mountains Conservancy (RMC) as a regional collaboration to support implementation of the Plan through continued engagement with community leaders, cities, and partner agencies; and

**WHEREAS**, the campaign promotes the idea that as investments in parks and river infrastructure move forward, they should be paired with thoughtful strategies that promote housing security, support workforce development, and help residents and small businesses remain in place, ensuring revitalization efforts are inclusive and community-focused; and

**WHEREAS**, the City of [CITY NAME] values tools such as the Supporting Stronger, Greener Communities a report on housing, homelessness, and workforce development policies and other planning resources developed through the campaign, and supports continued efforts to identify approaches that reflect community needs and promote neighborhood continuity and well-being; and

**WHEREAS**, this work aligns with the goals of statewide initiatives such as Proposition 1, Proposition 68 and Prop 4, which seek to fund environmental restoration, access to green space, and equitable infrastructure investments;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the City of [CITY NAME] affirms its support for the Lower LA River Para Todos campaign and its commitment to advancing a community-informed vision for the Lower LA River that reflects the values of equity, environmental stewardship, and inclusive growth;

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the City encourages continued collaboration with the Rivers and Mountains Conservancy, local organizations, and public agencies to ensure that public investments along the river benefit existing residents and contribute to a more connected, healthy, and inclusive region for all.
